IOF MTB Orienteering Event Advisers' Clinic and Organisers' Workshop to be held <u>online</u> on 29th November and 7th December 2025

This Event Advisers' Clinic and Organisers' Workshop will focus on the requirements of a high-level IOF MTBO event. It is organised for the education of event advisers and organisers and for the recruitment of new event advisers in the field of MTBO.

Target group

- Active MTB orienteers who want to obtain the licence as an MTBO Event Adviser.
 The requirements for licensing are mentioned in the box on the second page of this invitation, but full attendance at a clinic such as this is a key requirement for accreditation as an IOF MTBO Event Adviser.
- MTBO Event Advisers who want to refresh their knowledge.
- Experienced MTBO organisers who want to play major roles in organising future high-level IOF events (WMTBOC, EMTBOC or World Cup events, WMMTBOC, JWMTBOC, EJYMTBOC) but do not necessarily want to become an Event Adviser.

Other participants (athletes, coaches, course planners, federation officials, etc.) are also welcome.

- Be an active and experienced MTB orienteer.
- Have competed in MTB orienteering in countries other than your own.
- Have successfully controlled or played a major part in the organisation of a national or international MTB orienteering event in the last 3 years.
- Be competent in the English language.
- Have attended an IOF MTBO EAs' clinic (for this clinic, participation in <u>all</u> 7 modules is required).
- Have completed the MTBO EA's online test if the clinic was held digitally.
- Be familiar with the IOF MTBO Competition Rules and other relevant publications.
- Be recognised as an expert in MTB orienteering and endorsed as suitable by your federation.
